Inyo Council for the Arts is excited that you'll be joining us for the 29th annual Millpond Music Festival!

The Millpond Recreation Area is an Inyo County park. In addition to these guidelines, all Inyo County rules and regulations must be observed.

Millpond Checklist - Don't forget!

The following guidelines are meant to ensure that everyone has a positive festival experience. The Millpond team works hard to make the festival great! Please do your part by respecting the following guidelines:

- **All California and Inyo County Department of Public Health guidelines must be followed. Please be prepared to follow any mask requirements and/or social distancing measures.**
- **NO PETS in the park.** As per county regulations, no dogs or other animals are allowed in the Millpond Recreation Area, with the exception of Service Animals as defined by the ADA. This policy is strictly enforced.
- Everyone must display an appropriate wristband at all times during the festival. Wear the wristband on your left wrist.
- Main stage seating is separated into two areas, with the space nearest the stage reserved for chairs with low backs. Umbrellas and shade structures are allowed in designated areas only, where they will not block anyone's view.
- Keep your valuables with you or in a locked vehicle at all times. Immediately report any suspicious activity to Millpond security staff or volunteers, who will assist in notifying law enforcement as needed. Inyo Council for the Arts is not responsible for any lost or stolen items.
- Once again, **no pets are allowed on the festival grounds.** Pets are allowed in the Brown's campground only.
- Absolutely NO campfires outside of designated fire rings in Brown's Campground per the Inyo National Forest and the Bureau of Land Management. Don't leave hot coals on the ground. **Please be fire safe!**
- **No video or audio taping of artists.** Please respect the wishes of our performers by not recording their performances in any way unless the artist explicitly permits audience members to do so.
- No firearms or other weapons at the festival.
- Generators in the Shoreline camping area only.
- The sale of goods or services is restricted to those approved in advance by ICA.
- **Your Millpond Tickets and Camping Tags**
- Weather at the festival can be unpredictable. We've seen everything from scorching heat to sudden rain, heavy wind, and hailstorms. In general we anticipate warm days and cool nights, but **please come prepared with clothing that can withstand whatever the elements throw our way.**
- **Sunscreen**, sunglasses, lotion, lip balm, hats, and bug repellent are recommended.
- Please remember to **stay hydrated** throughout the weekend!
- Frisbees, Hula Hoops, Hacky Sacks, and other fun outdoor activities are welcome! Please keep these activities at a safe distance from crowds.
- Bring swim gear and towels if you want to swim in the pond!
- We will have medical staff on site during the hours of approx. 6-10pm Friday, 10am-10pm Saturday, and 9am-7pm Sunday. **We do recommend bringing a personal first aid kit, especially if you have specific needs or medications.**

For Campers:

- All campsites at Millpond have accessible restroom facilities. Shower tokens can be purchased at Brown's Campground. There are food vendors on site. **Please come prepared with all other necessities for camping throughout the weekend.** This may include a shade tent (shade is sparse in some of our campsites), a camp stove (above ground only please), folding chairs, lantern/flashlight/headlamp, as well as the usual necessities. Some camping essentials are available at Brown's Host Store; the town of Bishop is also a short drive from the festival.
- **Jamming is allowed in the campsites.** We love that you keep the music going, but we do ask that you please be considerate of your neighbors who may be trying to sleep. Light sleepers, and those not inclined to jam into the night, may consider bringing earplugs.

DIRECTIONS TO THE PARK:

Coming from the South: Drive north on HWY 395 through the town of Bishop. About 5 miles north of Bishop, turn left onto Ed Powers Road. (There will be a sign for the Millpond County Park.) Take the first right onto Sawmill Road. Continue for approximately 1 mile. The entrance to Millpond County Park will be on the left.

Coming from the North: Driving south on HWY 395, about 4 miles after Pine Creek Road and before the town of Bishop, turn right onto Ed Powers Road. (There will be a sign for the Millpond County Park.) Take the first right onto Sawmill road. Continue for approximately 1 mile. The entrance to Millpond County Park will be on the left.
